

What a BMC Volunteer **CANNOT** Do

1. Touch any coils – they cannot put the coil on the MRI bed or put it away
2. Touch the MR scanner bed controls - volunteers cannot operate the table buttons at any time
3. Set up the subject in the scanner room or on the bed *by themselves*
4. Verify that the participant is safe to scan based on the MR screening form
5. Touch the Physiologic devices
6. Wand the subject for metal on their person
7. Register the subject or operate the MRI scanner computer

What a BMC Volunteer **CAN** Do

1. Review the MR screening form for *completeness* ONLY
2. Assist staff when positioning subjects on the scanner bed
3. Give the subject MR safe clothing to change into
4. Hand the subject earplugs
5. Hand the subject button box or headphones
6. Hand the subject Emergency Squeeze ball
7. Hand the subject prescription lenses
8. Turn on LCD, headphones and stimuli/movie computers
9. Operate stimuli/movie computers
10. Read task/stimuli instructions or ask survey questions ONLY if reading a script
11. Clean up scanner room and control room (except for the coil and physio)
12. Serve as a MR Safety Second
